### Head Lice

Please continue to remain vigilant around head lice, occasionally there is a case reported. Helpful lice hints...

- 1. Check for Lice, look for tiny bugs (lice) or their eggs (nits) in the hair.
- 2. Brush hair with a special comb, this is called a robi comb.
- 3. Apply conditioner.
- 4. Keep combing every few days for several weeks to catch all lice and eggs.
- 5. Use lice treatment.
- 6. Tell others, let people know who are close to you.
- 7. Wash everything like bedding, clothes, and towels in hot water.
- 8. Clean your home: Vacuum carpets and furniture to get rid of lice or eggs.
- 9. Ask for help if needed.




#### Downloading the Skool Loop app - a step by step guide
