I hope you all had a lovely Easter break, there is only one week left until the end of the term!

Lately, I have noticed that there have been some students arriving late to school. This is an issue because being late to school has a significant impact on the learning of the child who is late, and also on the class. Being on time teaches children to be responsible and shows respect, whereas being late can make people seem unreliable and disrespectful. A regular morning routine and getting things ready the night before can help lateness. Thank you for your support to make sure that every child is on time and ready to learn at 9am at Waikaka School.

The WCD Swimming Sports were held last Wednesday in Gore. Our Yr 4-8 students represented Waikaka extremely well. It was an honour to be a part of the event this year. I am very proud of the way our children took part and showed the value of competition (tauwhāinga). This value means aiming for excellence and it was great to see this in action. Additionally, it made me proud to hear our children cheering on other competitors and showing good sportspersonship as part of the competition value. I am unsure currently who has won the annual shield and will let you know as soon as I am made aware of this information.

Kapa Haka will continue to be offered at Waikaka School this year. We have made some changes to sessions based on what our children have told us. Currently, the open Thursday session is proving to be popular with many new faces opting in to experience dance, and singing in te reo Māori. Children have been enjoying themselves and the older children are supporting younger children. Important note - Leading up to performances (such as the Pomahaka Kāhui Ako - 'Mauri Ora') the learning sessions of Kapa Haka will be aimed at children who have committed to these performances. This is to ensure that their dancing and singing is polished and that they are ready for the stage. If they opt into the performance group this is by no means compulsory, however, we would like to see a commitment from children who have decided that performance is for them, as this is what teamwork is. This information will be communicated clearly to children (commitment but not compulsory). Teachers are presently developing a culture and language plan aimed at offering a variety of enriching experiences that will expose all children to a range of learning. We look forward to developing our culture and language plan further and will be experimenting with different ideas and scenarios to find the best way forward. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions or concerns around this.

We are all very excited about Grandparents day next Friday. I have heard that it is a real highlight on the calendar and I look forward to meeting more people in our community, and hearing stories from the past. I recently came across a centennial book called "Waikaka & District Schools' ~ Pictorial. It fascinated me and I spent a couple of hours looking through this and reading about local history of the schools. It is a really valuable piece of history.

I have almost completed one term as Tumuaki (Principal) at Waikaka School. I've spent the term listening, interacting and observing how things work and most importantly how people interact with each other. I see the absolute potential in Waikaka School and I look forward to working together to make positive change. I want to thank staff for the quality teaching and care of the children that they provide. It is an absolute honour to hear teachers talking about what they are doing in classrooms to cater for all learning needs. I am really enjoying all the families and the people in this community. Thank you for your positivity.

Natalie Eade: For being incredibly resilient. You are showing confidence in your own abilities and supporting others along the way.


Helena Byars: For being ready to listen and learn. This is so helpful for you and your classmates. Well done for working hard to be on task.



- Subscribe to the groups that are relevant to you, then click the 'go back' button on your phone, which will bring you to the main screen of your schools app.










